FOR YOUR SCOUT'S SUMMER

Travel back to the days of yore with the Knights of Nanticoke!

Cub Scout Resident Camp is for boys entering the second and third grades. Camp sessions last



for 3 days and 2 nights and are geared toward an introduction to the outdoor program of the Boy Scouts of America. Activities are developed around Cub Scout advancement requirements and are theme oriented.

Webelos Resident Camp is for boys entering the fourth and fifth grades. Webelos Camp lasts for 6 days and 5 nights and is an introduction to Long-term camping. Special Webelos mini-sessions are also available lasting 3 days and 2 nights for those who prefer a shorter stay. The program in both types of Webelos sessions is developed around Webelos outdoor activities and advancement requirements.

WHY?

Cub and Webelos Resident camp is an introduction to camping. It is not meant to be Boy Scout camping, but rather a shorter, less strenuous type of camping. A parent is encouraged to attend with their son.



The primary objective is to provide Cubs and Webelos, parents and other leaders with a meaningful, fun filled experience, and to strengthen parent-son relationships.

What can you find at Cub and Webelos Resident Camp?

DEN ORGANIZATION Campers will be divided into camp dens upon arrival.

CAMP STAFF The camp is operated by a high quality, trained staff. All of our key area directors are trained and certified at BSA National Camping Schools. A camp staff member known as a Program Specialist is assigned to each camp den.



MEALS are prepared in our camp kitchen and served. Campers eat in our luxurious dining hall, where camp staff conducts a program after each meal.

CAMP PROGRAM: GAMES-CRAFTS-HIKES-FISHING-BOATING-SWIMMING A daily camp program plan will be prepared by the camp staff for each camp den in attendance. The program plan will contain specific information on activity periods & location as well as information about campwide activities.

DEN TIME Dens will also be given time to do activities on their own.

ADVANCEMENT OPPORTUNITIES Most activities in the program areas are developed using the advancement requirements from the Cub and Webelos handbooks. A list will be provided of the topics covered.

HEALTH LODGE A qualified first aider is on duty 24 hours a day, supervised by a licensed physician.

CAMP SITES Scouts and parents live together in a campsite with canvas tents and wooden floors. Each tent has two cots. Tents are arranged around a picnic table with a canvas roof. All campsites have a campfire ring, water and bathroom facilities.

Modern comfort stations WITH FLUSH TOILETS are available for all Scouts and Adults.

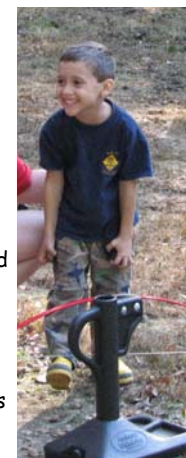
Reservations A Must!
